

Hulsey's Body Found in River

Houseboat Door Is Found Open

The body of a 38-year-old Pensacola man was found in Perdido River Sunday night.

He was identified as Carl E. Hulsey, of 111 State St.

Deputy Sheriff Philip Bell reported an unidentified employee of Ruby's Fish Camp, off Highway 90 on the river, called the sheriff's office and reported Hulsey's houseboat had been found open, his jacket in the house boat and his car nearby. Hulsey, however, was not in or around his home, he said.

The Escambia Search and Rescue Unit located the body after about three hours of searching, Bell said.

Hulsey reportedly was last seen about 12:30 a.m. Sunday. His fully clothed body was found in eight feet of water about 12 feet from the shore.

He was a veteran of World War II and disabled veteran of the Korean War. He was an employee of the Naval Air Station and a member of the Baptist Church.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Janet Hulsey of Pensacola;

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a daughter, Miss Carla Hulsey of Pensacola; his mother Mrs. Minnie Hulsey of Tulsa, Okla.; three sisters, Mrs. Betty Powers, Mrs. Lorene Carpenter and Mrs. Gladys Reed, all of Tulsa; four brothers, Billy Hulsey, El Dene Hulsey of Tulsa, Lavaughn and Frank Hulsey of California.

Worker's Body Found

A 38-year-old employe of Pensacola NAS died Sunday at his houseboat on Perdido River, apparently of drowning.

The body of Carl Hulsey, 111 State St., Pensacola, was found in eight feet of water Sunday night by the Escambia Search and Rescue Unit after about three hours of searching.
