

Movie Goes On

Bomb Threat Held Hoax

An extensive search was made at the Twinair Drive-In Theater on Navy Boulevard last night after the sheriff's office had received an anonymous telephone report that a bomb had been placed at the outdoor movie.

About 40 men from the sheriff's office, the Escambia County Search and Rescue Unit, the National Guard and the Warrington Volunteer Fire Department conducted the search and determined the bomb threat had been a hoax.

Sheriff's Investigator Bill Lynch said the switch-

board operator at the county jail received a telephone call about 8 p.m. and the caller's voice was identified as that of an adult male.

"I thought you'd like to know there's a bomb at the Twinair Drive-In Theater", the operator said the voice reported before breaking the connection.

Lynch said a thorough search was made for nearly an hour, starting shortly after 8 p.m. of the theater's concession house, and the screen and the parking area.

The search did not disrupt the movie and the show went on as usual, Lynch said.
